The sequence listed above is based on an 18 hour major. Elective hours will vary for each student, must be taken for a grade, and are only needed to reach the 124 hour minimum to graduate. Electives may be used towards a second major in the Business School or a minor outside of the Business School. Course selection is subject to availability and fit within each semester.

*Business Core

**BUSI 1301 at MCC can transfer as BUS 1201 on the BBA degree if taken pre-matriculation.

External Transfers must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA in their transfer work to declare Pre-Business upon admittance to Baylor.

A student's Baylor GPA only includes the grades earned in Baylor courses - no transfer credit grades are included in this GPA.

Students must earn a 3.0 GPA in their Baylor coursework to complete the admission requirements for the business school.

Students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 in order to take ACC 2303, ACC 2304, ECO 2306, ECO 2307, QBA 2302, and BUS 2101 at Baylor.

After entering Baylor, a student may transfer in a maximum of 15 semester hours.

Courses taken at Baylor may not be repeated at another school for degree credit.

Courses taken at Baylor for which the grade is a "C" or better may not be repeated.

To earn a major in Accounting, a student must attain a minimum of a "B" average in ACC 2303 and 2304.

To earn a major in Finance, students must earn a minimum of a "B-" in FIN 3310 as their first grade earned.

To earn a major in Professional Selling, a student must apply separately to this program in addition to his/her business school application.

Language/Communication Requirement:

Complete one modern or classical language through the second level including American Sign Language, either 1302, 1412 or 1306

Any 2nd semester or higher foreign language course at MCC could fulfill both Areas of this requirement, including American Sign Language

OR Complete one course from Area A and Area B

Area A: Choose one course from: Any foreign language, BUS 3330, JOU/FDM 3372, or ENG/PWR 3000-level or 4000-level - *Any foreign language course at MCC could fulfill this category (including American Sign Language)*

Area B: Choose one course from: Any foreign language (including American Sign Language), ACC 4350, AS 3302, BUS 3303, ENT 3301, FAS 1311, MILS 3302 or any additional JOU, FDM, ENG, CSS, LDS, GTX course.

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Both GOVT 2305 and 2306 must be complete before coming to Baylor to receive credit for PSC 1387.

BBA MAJORS

A BBA student must complete coursework leading toward a major of 12 to 18 hours in a particular field. A student may choose a major from the following: **Accounting, Economics, Entrepreneurship and Corporate Innovation, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business** (second major only), **Management, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Professional Selling, Risk Management and Insurance, Supply Chain Management.**

FIRST YEAR REQUIREMENTS FOR THE B.B.A. DEGREE

In order to continue as a Pre-Business major beyond the first year, a student must complete a minimum of 24 credit hours at Baylor; maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA; and complete BUS 1101, BUS 1201, BUS 1350, Research Writing course, MTH 1308/1320 (if needed), and MTH 1309/1321 with a minimum grade of "C" in each course. If these requirements are not met, the student must change degree programs.

ADMISSION TO THE HANKAMER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Application for admission to the Business School must be made during the semester a student is completing 60 hours (with at least 12 Baylor hours). In order to be considered for admission, a student must satisfactorily complete the first year requirements listed above, have a minimum 3.0 cumulative Baylor GPA and complete ACC 2303, ACC 2304, BUS 2101, ECO 2306, ECO 2307, and QBA 2302 with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.

For students meeting the academic requirements, the following will also be considered in the admission decision: a completed application form, a student resume, a statement of personal and professional goals, and a curriculum and graduation plan including a desired major. An interview may be required in some cases. If a student has a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA, consideration for admission will be deferred one semester if all requirements can be met in the following semester a student is enrolled at Baylor (two summer sessions count as one semester). Students who do not meet the admission requirements at 60 hours (plus another semester, if deferred) will be required to change degree programs.

Pre-Business students cannot progress into upper division business courses (3000-4000 level) until they have been admitted to the Business School. The only exception to this policy is for those students who have successfully taken the suggested (advised) sequence of lower core courses and should logically begin taking an upper division business core course. However, under no circumstances will a Pre-Business student be allowed to take a course in a major. In addition, a Pre-business student who has a cumulative GPA less than 3.0 will not be permitted to take 2000-level or above business courses.

Current Baylor students must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and 12 hours in residence to request to change to the Pre-Business major. Students must internally transfer no later than the end of the semester in which they complete 45 Baylor (in-residence) hours. Students will not be allowed to transfer internally if they have already exceeded the School of Business excessive retake policy. Internal transfers must follow all of the policies of the current catalog at the time they change to the BBA degree.

External transfers (students transferring to Baylor from another institution) desiring to enter Baylor as a Pre-Business student must have a minimum 3.0 external GPA.

ACADEMIC DEFICIENCY POLICY

Pre-Business students' cumulative GPAs are reviewed at the end of each semester. If a student's cumulative GPA falls below a 3.00, the student is placed on academic deficiency. Pre-Business students are permitted to have a cumulative GPA less than 3.00 only once. If a Pre-Business student falls below a 3.00 cumulative GPA during a second semester, they are required to change degree programs. The semesters do not have to be consecutive.
