- *ASHA required courses (ASHA requires that students complete courses in Biological Science, Physical Science, Statistics, and Social & Behavioral Sciences; Psychology is strongly recommended to meet the Social Science requirement)
- Minimum 3.0 GPA average in the CSD courses required for retention in the major.
