The sequence listed above is based on an 18 hour major. Elective hours will vary for each student, must be taken for a grade, and are only needed to reach the 124 hour minimum to graduate. Electives may be used towards a second major in the Business School or a minor outside of the Business School. Course selection is subject to availability and fit within each semester.

*Business Core

**Students wanting to major in Finance or Economics must complete MTH 1321 (Calculus I). All other majors may take MTH 1311 (Mathematics for Business Analysis). While there is not a direct equivalent to MTH 1311 at MCC, students can utilize MATH 1325 (at MCC) towards the MTH 1311 requirement if taken pre-matriculation.

External Transfers must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA in their transfer work to declare Pre-Business upon admittance to Baylor.

A student's Baylor GPA only includes the grades earned in Baylor courses - no transfer credit grades are included in this GPA.

Students must earn a 3.0 GPA in their Baylor coursework to complete the admission requirements for the business school.

After entering Baylor, a student may transfer in a maximum of 15 semester hours.

Courses taken at Baylor may not be repeated at another school for degree credit.

Courses taken at Baylor for which the grade is a "C" or better may not be repeated.

To earn a major in Accounting, a student must attain a minimum of a "B" average in ACC 2303 and 2304.

To earn a major in Finance, students must earn a minimum of a "B-" in FIN 3310 as their first grade earned.

To earn a major in Professional Selling, a student must apply separately to this program in addition to his/her business school application.

OR Complete one course from Area A and Area B

Area A: Choose one course from: Any foreign language, BUS 3330, JOU 3372, or ENG/ENGL/CW/PWR 3000-level or 4000-level - *Any foreign language course at MCC could fulfill this category (including American Sign Language)*

Area B: Choose one course from: Any foreign language (including American Sign Language), AS 3302, BUS 3303, ENT 3301, FAS 1311, MILS 3302 or any additional JOU, FDM, ENG, ENGL, CW, PWR, CSS, LDS, GTX course.

ADMISSION TO THE HANKAMER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Pre-Business students must earn a 3.0 GPA with a "C" or higher in the following requirements to be able to declare a major:

- BUS 1350 Software Applications for Bus Students
- MTH 1311 Math for Bus Analysis or 1321 Calculus I
- Research Writing course

- ECO 2306 Microeconomics
- ECO 2307 Macroeconomics
- QBA 2302 Business Data Analysis I

Application for admission to the Business School is made whenever Pre-Business students are in the process of completing their final set of admission requirements. have a minimum 12 Baylor hours to apply.

BBA MAJORS

A BBA student must complete coursework leading toward a major of 15 to 18 hours in a particular field. A student may choose a major from the following: **Accounting, Economics, Entrepreneurship and Corporate Innovation, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business** (second major only), **Management, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Professional Selling, Supply Chain Management.**

ACADEMIC DEFICIENCY POLICY

Pre-Business students' cumulative GPAs are reviewed at the end of each semester. The first time a student's cumulative GPA falls below 3.0, the student is placed on academic deficiency. Pre-Business students are permitted to have a cumulative GPA less than 3.0 only once, and a second occurrence requires a change in degree programs. The semesters do not have to be consecutive.
